SCHOOL BACKGROUND

Constructed in 1997-1998, Amelia Earhart Elementary serves the southwest corner of Provo. Built to house 550 students, the school opened on Tuesday, August 25, 1998. The school is on a traditional schedule and opened with an enrollment of over 550 students. The school name was chosen from patron and student input. The school motto is "Flying High with Pride." The school mascot is the Aviator. In 2001, six additional classrooms were built on to help facilitate growth in the area.

Curriculum

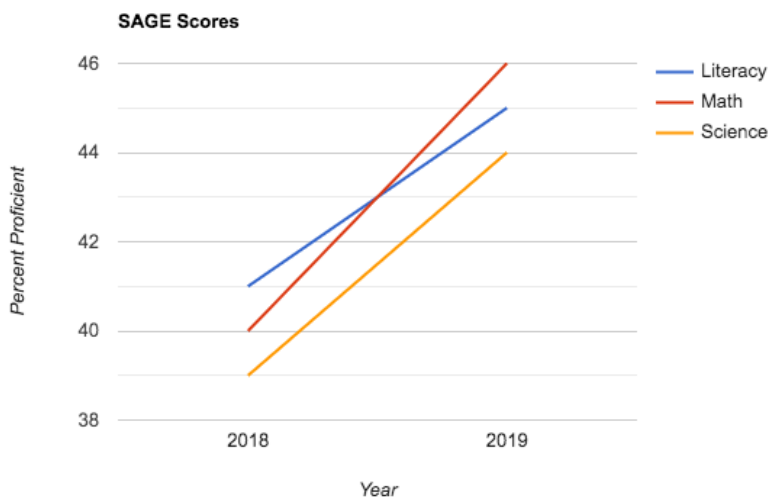
- Researched based programs in literacy and math
- 3-tier model with daily differentiated interventions in literacy and math
- PE, music, choir, orchestra, and art are offered for all students
- Extensive before and after school programs
- Enrichment and Gifted/Talented opportunities

Computers and Technology

- 7 mobile computer labs (2 MacBook Air labs, 5 chromebook labs)
- 8 1:1 classrooms (1 laptop computer for every student)
- 1 iPad lab
- Classrooms are equipped with enhanced sound systems with a teacher microphone and a handheld student microphone
- Most classrooms have an interactive board

SUCCESSSES

- Implementation of Professional Learning Communities— teachers meet weekly for 90 minutes to discuss student needs, guaranteed essentials, common assessments, enrichment, targets and reteaching
- All regular education teachers have completed or are enrolled in an ESL endorsement program.
- We have 50 students participate in the school choir, 29 6th graders in the school orchestra, and 27 6th grade students in band.
- Implementation of a successful before- and after-school program which targets essential skills taught to students
