For 1st-6th graders

After School is a free program for 1st-6th grade students to participate in a variety of activities, get homework help, receive academic tutoring, and develop social and emotional skills.

Before and After School programming provides a safe atmosphere for students to develop skills and understanding to thrive in a 21 Century world and support them in their academic achievement. While specific activities or projects differ from class to class, every class aims to support students in their development of critical thinking, of social and emotional intelligence, and to foster a love of learning.

Homework and After School

In every class students are provided 10-15 minutes for homework time. This semester we are also providing a Homework Lab Monday-Thursday. Homework Lab is meant to be a small study hall setting where students may receive more time, support, and tutoring to support them in their academic success.

Because we are committed to providing the best, most effective programming for all of our participants, we have designed Homework Lab to keep the class size low and to be only a part of a students' After School experience. Therefore, students will need special permission from the director, Emma Hoskisson, to attend Homework Lab more than twice a week. We've evolved our programming to support the needs of our participants and to follow the recommendations of researchers. Students are in great need of programming that supports them in their development as a person and a citizen of our communities. We are proud to provide quality programs that support the development of the whole child. Developing these skills leads to success in all aspects of life, including the classroom.

Things are slightly different this Spring

All classes are split up according to grade levels: 5-6th, 3-4th, 1-2nd. Students and their families must design their After School Schedule together by signing up for what classes they'll be attending. Emma Hoskisson is happy to answer questions about this process and teachers may have recommendations for which classes they recommend for your student. Students won't be allowed to switch between classes. If there is a compelling reason a student needs to change their schedule, students and families will need to petition the director, Emma Hoskisson.

Snacks

Snacks are provided by the Federal Child Nutrition program for students who are enrolled in and participate in After School. Snack is only for students who will be participating in an After School class that day.

Transportation

There is a bus that will stop at each of the regular Amelia Earhart bus stops. Students can also walk home or be picked up. Before a student participates in After School, we must know from parents/guardians what method of transportation students will take home. Please notify After School staff before 3:00 pm if students will be taking an alternate method of transportation other than what's marked on the enrollment form. This helps us ensure the safety of our students. You can contact After School by calling/texting 801-210-8104.

*Ballroom will have a separate enrollment form, class will start mid-February.

*Some classes such as Lego Robotics and Ballroom will have different end dates that will be announced once competition/performance dates have been set. Typically the Lego Robotics competition is a Saturday in mid-April. The Ballroom performance at PHS is typically on a Saturday after the first full week in May.

Attendance—regular is key

Students are expected to attend their scheduled classes regularly. Inconsistent attendance is a safety concern for us as well as diminishing the benefits your child gains from After School.

Early Pickups

If you need to check your student out early from the After School Program, you will need to contact staff by calling or texting the After School phone number 801-210-8104. There will be a special sign out sheet for such occasions.

- *Allow 15 minutes* from the time of contact to when your student will be ready.
- *Do not go looking for your student*, this is disruptive to classes and jeopardizes the safety of the students.
- *Please minimize early pick-ups*. In addition to this being disruptive to classes and activities, we have limited staffing so special requests can be burdensome.

Communication

We will communicate through emails, texts, notes sent home with students, and occasional phone calls. We will keep all such transmissions to a minimum.
